FY 07/08 Goals

- 1. Educate executive representatives from all 58 California counties on the essential role of the County Architect/Engineer in public sector capital improvement projects.
- 2. Inform representatives of all 58 California counties of CCAEA's purpose and mission.
- 3. Apply as a State of California non-profit organization.
- 4. Increase membership in organization by 10%.

FY 07/08 Objectives

- 1. Publish position paper on the Definition and Purpose of the County Architect/Engineer by December 31, 2007.
- 2. Position CCAEA as leader within statewide GSA by holding a luncheon meeting and presenting two seminars at Counties General Services Academy V in San Luis Obispo from September 19-21, 2007.
- 3. Create by-laws and have them approved by the general membership by March 31, 2008.
- 4. Hold two CCAEA meetings prior to June 30, 2007; one in northern California and one in southern California.
- 5. Send invitation and invoices for membership to join the Association to existing and prospective members by September 30, 2007.
- 6. Submit application as a California non-profit organization to State by March 31, 2008.
- 7. Update format and content of website by June 30, 2008.
